Preliminary programme -12th CHBG meeting

Update on The Cochrane Hepato- Biliary **Group achievements**

During the five years of existence of the CHBG. reviewers have made great scientific endeavours to produce interesting and good-quality protocols and reviews. This is evident from the 72 protocols and reviews, published on The Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews*, as well as from the number of protocols and reviews presently undergoing editorial processing.

The **new reviews** in Issue 4, 2001 are:

- Benzodiazepine receptor antagonists for acute and chronic hepatic encephalopathy,
- Medicinal herbs for hepatitis C virus infection,
- S-adenosyl-L-methionine for alcoholic liver diseases.

The new protocols in Issue 4, 2001 are:

News from Cochrane Collaboration Steering Group:

Complimentary copies of The Cochrane Library

A letter sent by Mike Clarke

In light of the decision and subsequent announcement made earlier this year that, from Issue 2, 2002 of The Cochrane Library, complimentary CD-ROMS will only be sent to contact reviewers who have at least one "up-

to-date" review in The Cochrane Library, I have been working with Hazim from Update Software to identify the contact reviewers who will not be automatically sent a complimentary CR-ROM disk from Issue 2, 2002 onwards, unless at least one of their reviews is brought "up-to-date" before the submission for that issue. For these purposes, an "up-to-date" review means one that satisfies at least one of the following:

 The review was first published in or more recently than Issue 4, 1999 of The Cochrane Library (that is, 10 Issues before Issue 2, 2002)

OR

- The "date of last substantive update" is more recent than 5 September 1999
 OR
- The "date of new studies sought but none found" is more recent than 5 September 1999

OR

 The "date new studies found and included or excluded" is more recent than 5 September 1999

Furthermore, there is a new Cochrane policy on updating reviews. It says that Cochrane reviews should be updated at least once every two years and if not, the reviews have to be removed from The Cochrane Library. The framework also applies to protocols.

The CHBG Editorial Team Office hopes that this information will highlight the achievements of the CHBG reviewers in the preparation of systematic reviews and will serve as an inspiration to many novice and experienced researches and practitioners interested in scientific research in evidence-based medicine.

Past events

The CHBG one-day symposium, Prague - 17 April 2001

The CHBG run a one-day EASL-sponsored symposium in Prague on evidence-based medicine on 17 April 2001. Around 350 people were present. The speakers were William Rosenberg, UK; Thierry Poynard, France; Luigi Pagliaro, Italy; Rosanna Simonetti, Italy; Ulrich Tröhler, Switzerland, Andrew Burroughs, UK; Bodil Als-Nielsen, Denmark; Christian Gluud, Denmark; Lise Lotte Kjaergard, Denmark; Torben Jørgensen,

Denmark; Gennaro D'Amico, Italy; Ronald Koretz, USA and Robert Suttton, UK. The symposium was a great success and EASL secretary, Jordi Bruix, has kindly expressed that he found this symposium a highly satisfactory event and this means that it is definitely worth continuing this type of event, as it is beneficial both for The CHBG and EASL.

The CHBG had also a booth at the EASL exhibition from 18.04 to 22.04.2001. New members of the CHBG were recruited. We thank all who visited the booth and expressed their interest in participating in the work of The CHBG.

Cochrane editing workshop, Copenhagen - 6 to 8 Sept 2001

Dimitrinka Nikolova, Lise Lotte Kjaergard, and Christian Gluud represented The CHBG. Many relevant questions were discussed and among them was the one on open versus anonymous peer refereeing. Most of the participants were for open peer refereeing since knowing the identity of authors and not vice versa, increases the risk of abuse. In this connection we will appreciate if you could share with us your own thoughts. All the comments received will be summarized to provide you with a feedback. Empirical evidence has shown that the quality of open peer refereeing is as good as concealed peer refereeing. If we do not get a storm of protest, The CHBG will introduce open peer refereeing during 2002.

Visits

Rosanna Simonetti, a CHBG reviewer and associate editor of The CHBG, from Italy, came to Copenhagen in September to work for two months on three systematic reviews. The topics are: - Albumin and other plasma expanders for ascites in cirrhotic patients; Interferon for hepatocellular carcinoma; and Interferon for prevention of hepatocellular carcinoma.

Andrea Rambaldi, a CHBG reviewer from Italy, visited The CHBG in October for a week to work on the systematic reviews entitled 'Propylthiouracil for alcoholic liver disease' and 'Anabolic-androgenic steroids for alcoholic liver disease'.

Wendong Chen, a CHBG reviewer from China,

is another guest who will stay with The CHBG for six months to perform systematic reviews.

Having international collaborators is an ideal

opportunity to exchange knowledge and create a working place of energy and discussion. Finally, we all enjoy satisfaction in what has been accomplished.


